Amend the Code of the Town of Pelham bylaws Chapter 5 Animals, Article II Dog Control by making revisions shown below, with additions shown as underlined:

#### § Section 5-7 Violations enumerated)

Any owner who allows his/her dog to do any of the following will be considered in violation of this article:

- A. Unlicensed dog: a dog six months or older, which is unlicensed or not relicensed by May 31 each year.
- B. Running at large: to go beyond the boundaries of the owner's residence unless the dog is:
  - 1. In sight and under immediate response to voice command and does not trespass on residential property; or
  - 2. Under leash control; however, dogs in the act of training, working or hunting are excepted.
- C. To chase a pedestrian, bicycle or any other vehicle.
- D. To bark excessively during the day or to bark between 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. so as to disturb the reasonable quiet of the neighborhood.
- E. Worrying livestock: to worry, injure or kill another's livestock, fowl or pet.
- F. Vicious dog: to menace, attack or bite a person without provocation.

#### RATIONALE

The underlined language appears to have been inadvertently removed from the copy of the text of Section 5-7 as it was reproduced in Warrant Article 22 prior to the 2019 Town Meeting (5/11/2019). We believe this deletion was unintentional but the deletion was not, in any event, voted upon by the Town, as detailed below, and thus the language remains part of the Code.

Prior to the 2019 Town Meeting, Sections 5-3 and 5-7 of the Pelham Code read as follows:

#### §. 5-3 Purpose.

The town requires that all dog owners keep their dogs under control at all times for the purpose of protecting people and animals from injury, protecting property from damage and preventing dog-related nuisances.

§. 5-7 Violations enumerated.

Any owner who allows his/her dog to do any of the following will be considered in violation of this article:

- A. Unlicensed dog: a dog six months or older, which is unlicensed or not relicensed by May 31 each year.
- B. Running at large: to go beyond the boundaries of the owner's residence unless the dog is:
  - 1. In sight and under immediate response to voice command and does not trespass on residential property; or
  - 2. Under leash control; however, dogs in the act of training, working or hunting are excepted.
- C. To chase a pedestrian, bicycle or any other vehicle.

- D. To bark excessively during the day or to bark between 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. so as to disturb the reasonable quiet of the neighborhood.
- E. Worrying livestock: to worry, injure or kill another's livestock, fowl or pet.
- F. Vicious dog: to menace, attack or bite a person without provocation.

(Italics have been added for emphasis.) Note that Section 5-7 of the Code had two subsections: B.1 and B.2.

At the May 11, 2019 Town Meeting, the following Article 22, (which contained an incomplete statement of Section 5-7, subsection B) was presented to the Town for discussion and vote:

#### **ARTICLE 22**

.... to amend the Code of the Town of Pelham bylaws Chapter 5 Animals, Article II Dog Control [adopted 5-3-1997 ATM, Art. 10] by making revisions shown below, *with additions shown as underlined and deletions shown in strikethrough*:<sup>1</sup>[Bold in original text as presented to the Town].

#### §. 5-3 Purpose.

The town requires that all dog owners keep their dogs under control at all times for the purpose of protecting people and animals from injury, protecting property from damage and preventing dog-related nuisances. The Town further requires any dog for which one formal complaint has been filed be kept under the owners/guardians or keepers leash control at all times on town property.

§. 5-7 Violations enumerated.

Any owner who allows his/her dog to do any of the following will be considered in violation of this article:

- A. Unlicensed dog: a dog six months or older, which is unlicensed or not relicensed by May 31 each year.
- B. Running at large: to go beyond the boundaries of the owner's residence unless the dog is:
  - 1. Under leash control; however, dogs in the act of training, working or hunting are excepted.
- C. To chase a pedestrian, bicycle or any other vehicle.
- D. To bark excessively during the day or to bark between 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. so as to disturb the reasonable quiet of the neighborhood.
- E. Worrying livestock: to worry, injure or kill another's livestock, fowl or pet.
- F. Vicious dog: to menace, attack or bite a person without provocation.

Inexplicably, Section 5-7, subsection B.1 from the Code of Pelham was omitted from the Warrant language as presented to the Town, and B.2 became B.1; there was no mention in the Warrant of the change.

What the Town did discuss and vote upon was only to make the changes that were highlighted in the Warrant, "with additions shown as underlined and deletions shown in strikethrough." The Town voted only on the changes shown; it did not vote to approve or disapprove two entire subsections of the Code. The warrant did not show any revisions to be made to §5.7 of the Code, and only showed the one sentence to be added to Section 5-3. As anyone who was at that meeting can attest to, it was the addition of the one sentence that was thoroughly debated. Therefore, only change to Sections 5-3 or 5-7 that the Town Meeting voted to approve was the addition of the one sentence to Section 5-3; all other language of the Sections, including subsection B of Section 5-7 with its two parts, remained intact. Considerable confusion has developed since that Town Meeting as to the correct language of Section 5-7, subsection B. The proposed Warrant Article is intended to remove any ambiguity as to that language and clarify that it remains part of the Pelham Code.
